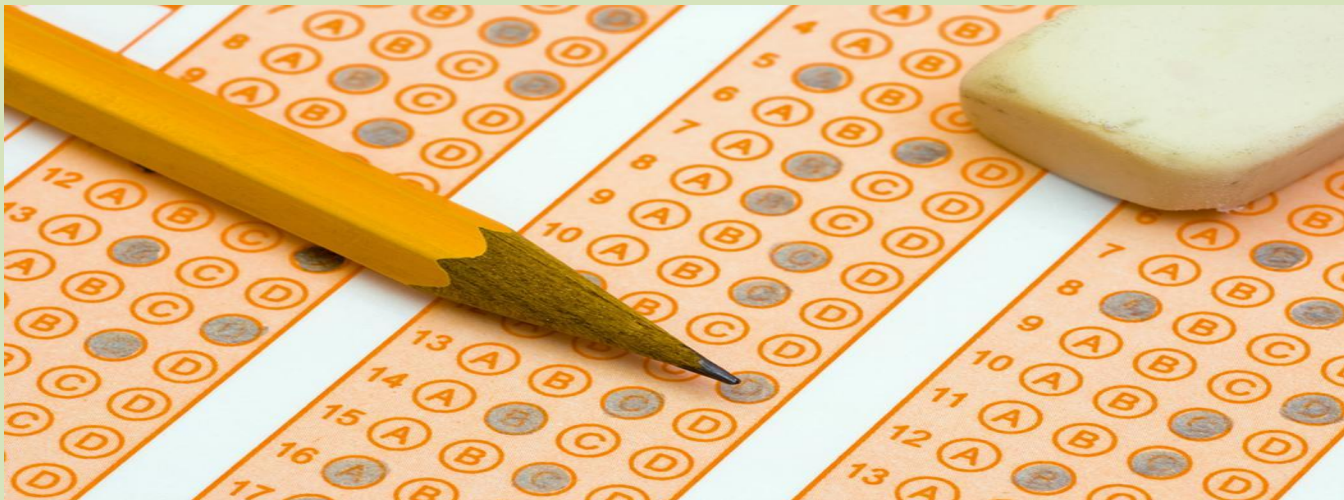

Step 2

Fill out all required general information.

- Kittatinny School Code: **311002**
- Choose a test date and test center along with a backup.
- Be sure to sign up for the SAT Test not the SAT Subject Test.
 - Designate whether you are taking it with or without the Writing Section
- Upload a headshot photo of yourself.
- Fill out the questionnaire as if you were a senior and have completed 4 years of English, 4 years of math, etc.

Sections of the SAT

- Critical Reading
 - Multiple-choice questions in the critical reading section based off of non-fiction, global/international issues, History/Social Studies, Science and career related topics.
- Mathematics
 - Content will be mostly Algebra I and II with some Geometry/Trig.
 - There is a Non-Calculator Section
 - Make sure you are familiar with the Calculator Policy before test day.
- Total score is out of 1600 (CR + M, 800 each section)

SAT Testing Dates and Deadlines

March 12th at Kittatinny
Must register by February 11th

May 7th at other locations
Must register by April 8th

June 4th at other locations
Must register by May 5th

ACT

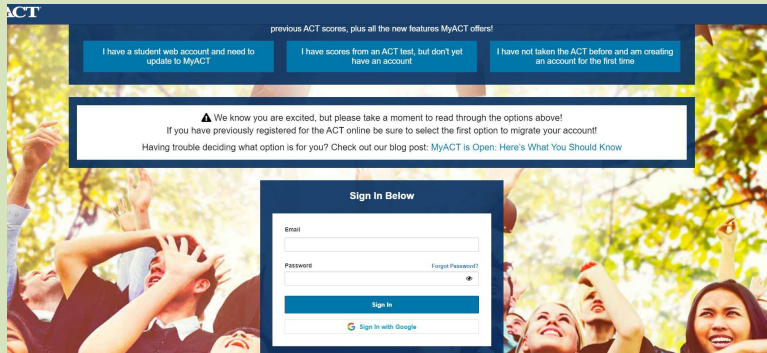
Description of the ACT

The ACT (No Writing) consists of four multiple-choice tests: English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science. The ACT Plus Writing includes the four multiple-choice tests and a [Writing Test](#).

Test			Content
English	75 questions	45 minutes	Measures standard written English and rhetorical skills.
Mathematics	60 questions	60 minutes	Measures mathematical skills students have typically acquired in courses taken up to the beginning of grade 12.
Reading	40 questions	35 minutes	Measures reading comprehension.
Science	40 questions	35 minutes	Measures the interpretation, analysis, evaluation, reasoning, and problem-solving skills required in the natural sciences.
Optional Writing Test	1 prompt	30 minutes	Measures writing skills emphasized in high school English classes and in entry-level college composition courses.

ACT

- Visit www.act.org to create an account to register.
 - Use the school code 311002 for Kittatinny.
 - Once you have created an account click the Register for test button to pick your test date.
- Follow the prompts to complete the registration process.
 - You may send your scores using the same username and password you created to sign up for the test.



ACT Testing Dates and Deadlines

April 2nd at other locations
Must register by February 25th

June 11th at other locations
Must register by May 7th

July 16th at other locations
Must register by June 17th

Sending Scores

- You get 4 **FREE** reports sent to colleges of your choice.
- You have the option of sending the scores at a later date for a cost of **\$12.00** per report for the SAT or **\$15.00** per report for the ACT.
- You must send your scores to the colleges you apply to directly from www.collegeboard.org.
 - Score Choice gives you the option to choose which scores you send to colleges — in accordance with an institution's stated score-use practice.
 - If you decide not to use Score Choice, all of your scores will be sent to your recipients. You should still feel comfortable sending all scores, since most colleges consider a student's best score.
- You must send your ACT scores from www.actstudent.org
- Send one report to 9999, the NCAA, if you are interested in Division I or II collegiate sports.

How many times should I take the SAT/ACT?

- If you plan to go to a **4 year college**, you want to take the SAT/ACT 1-2 times the Winter/Spring of your Junior year and 1-2 times the Fall of your Senior year.
 - March of Junior Year @ KRHS
 - May/June of Junior Year
 - Fall of Senior Year
- Test Fees:
 - SAT: \$55.00
 - ACT (no writing): \$60.00
 - ACT w/writing: \$85.00
- Fee Waivers are available for students who are on free and reduced lunch. See your school counselor if you meet the criteria.

Prep for the Test

- Practice SAT and ACT tests are offered throughout the school year and summer at KRHS.
- Kittatinny's SAT Prep Course
 - Limited space available
 - Courses are usually offered in the fall, winter and spring
- Kaplan and Princeton Review have courses for both the SAT and ACT
- Utilize the [Collegeboard.org](https://collegeboard.org) and [Act.org](https://act.org) website for free test prep.

Important Reminders for both the SAT/ACT tests

- You must bring a printed copy of your admissions ticket and a valid photo ID that is current. Your photo **MUST MATCH** the picture you uploaded.
 - The uploaded picture must only be a face forward headshot of you and only you.
 - If you forget to bring your ID, you will not be allowed to test (even if the proctor knows you).
 - Your ID must be from the current school year to be valid.
- You must also bring two #2 pencils
- Bring an approved calculator
- BE ON TIME!!!!
