GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

 Each student must complete a minimum of 140 credits

Full year course = 5 credits Half year course = 2.5 credits



EXCEPTIONS

- A full year <u>science lab</u> course = 6 credits
- A full year gym class or elective class will have <u>one credit deducted</u> if the course is missed 1 day per week due to a science lab. Course = 4 credits
- A <u>failed course</u> = 0 credits
- <u>No</u> credit given for <u>study halls</u>

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- A student must register for a minimum of **35** credits per year (7 courses).
- A student must maintain a minimum of **4** academic courses.

 Senior Structured Learning Environment (S.L.E.) students must have 3 academic courses.

ATTENDANCE

- A student must maintain good attendance having no more than 17 unexcused absences per year in a full-year course (8 absences for a semester course).
- You lose credit for excessive absences which can keep you from graduating on time.
- You can also lose credit by cutting class. Refer to the class cutting policy in the student handbook.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

- Students must pass
- •4 English courses
- •3 Social Studies courses (World, US1 & US2)
- •3 Mathematics courses (Algebra I & Geometry & Algebra II)
- •3 Science courses (Such as Bio/Life Science, Chemistry and Physics or their equivalent)
- •1 World Language course
- •4 Physical Education & Health courses
- •6 Electives

 1 out of the 6 must be a 21 Century Life & Careers)

 1 out of the 6 must be a Visual & Performing Arts course:

 1 out of the 6 must be a Financial Literacy course:

- Note: An extra academic class such as English class or Science class does not count as an elective.
- Drama can count as an <u>English</u> course OR <u>Visual & Performing Arts course</u>, but NOT both.
- Video can count as 21st Century Life & Careers OR Visual/Performing Art, but NOT both.

NJ STATE TESTING

- The <u>NJ-Start Strong</u> Test is tentatively scheduled for September 21st-23rd
- More information will be forthcoming once we hear back from the state.
- The <u>NJSLA</u> is scheduled for April.
 Must pass ELA Grade 10
 Must pass Algebra I

100 point GRADING SCALE

- A 90-100
- B 80-89
- C 70-79
- D 60-69
- F 0-59

When calculating GPA:


Add 10 points to total grade for AP Courses.

Add 8 points to total grade for Honors Courses.

Physical Education, Lunch and Study Halls are NOT included.

Grade Point Average and CLASS RANK

- GPA and Class Rank are determined once final grades are in for the school year.
- GPA and Class Rank are cumulative (grades 9-12).
- Once the GPA's are computed, they are ranked from highest to lowest in number order.
- The highest number is the Number 1 student in the class.








- A student should strive to be in the top half of the class and have <u>at least</u> a B average in order to be considered by a competitive 4 year college.
- NJ STARS Program is available for graduates in the top 15% of their class.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

- You can be eligible your junior and/or senior year.
- Selection based upon:
 - Character
 - Leadership
 - Service to school and community
 - GPA (90 or above)



SCHOLARSHIP ATHLETES



- Athletes who think they may be going to college on a Division I or Division II scholarship must take at least 16 core courses.
- The NCAA Clearinghouse must evaluate a potential student athletes academics to ensure one is eligible. Must maintain a 2.3 GPA for DIV I and 2.2 for Div II based on your NCAA approved "core courses" only.

KRHS ELIGIBILITY

- In order to participate in extracurricular activities you must be passing <u>7 courses</u>.
- If you have a study hall, you must be passing <u>all your courses</u>.
- Eligibility is checked after the 2nd and 4th marking periods and is based on the semester average and final average for the year.

SUMMER SCHOOL



- Not available at Kittatinny
- Usually at Mt. Olive and Lenape Valley H.S. at an approximate cost of \$300-\$500 per course.
 Some academic courses and physical education courses are usually offered.
- On-line classes are also available but must be pre-approved. Approximate cost is \$195 per course.
- If you pass a class in summer school that you failed for the year, you could become eligible for fall extracurricular activities.


<u>ASK FOR HELP</u> WHEN YOU NEED IT
