Self- Analysis

- Start thinking about your long range plans by evaluating your goals, interests, abilities and values:
 - What do you like to do?
 - What are your favorite classes/subject areas?
 - What careers have you researched or talked to others about?
- Talk to your family, friends, teachers and counselor about what you would like to do in the future.
- Utilize Naviance! You have already completed the Strengths Explorer and Career Interest Profiler in 9th and 10th grades. There is a wealth of career and college information on the site.

Research

- Utilize web-based platforms like Naviance, Collegeboard, Princeton Review, Occupational Outlook Handbook to learn about different careers and post-high school programs.
- Visit college websites and take virtual tours of the school.
- In January you will receive a "College Planning Guide" that contains all the information you will need.
- Utilize the Junior Year Planning Calendar!
- Attend all of the "Junior Class" college meetings.
- Visit the Guidance Website for specific junior year information as well as college and career planning resources.
- Attend virtual college fairs.

- You can receive free tuition at Sussex County Community College by being in the top 15% of your class at the end of your junior and/or senior year.

 - Everyone who applies is accepted. SAT/ACT scores are not required, but it can exempt you from taking the Accuplacer.

A few things to keep in mind this year...

- Colleges will look at:
 - High School Course Load and Grades
 - Test Scores (SAT and/or ACT) (unless test optional)
 - Essay or Writing Samples
 - Extra-curricular Activities Including Leadership Positions
 - Special Accomplishments, Honors and Awards
 - Letters of Recommendation
 - Interview (if applicable)

What should you be focusing on this year?



1. Completing your Resume

- Create a resume that includes the following:
 - School and Personal Information
 - School and Community Activities (include any leadership positions)
 - Honors and Awards
 - Work Experience
- Resume is a work in progress on your Google Drive
- At the end of the year, email your resume to your counselor and Mrs.
 Fuchs (<u>iryan@krhs.net</u>) for it to be posted onto your Naviance account.
- Resumes may be sent along with college applications and potential scholarships

2. Letters of Recommendation

- Start thinking of about 2 teachers to ask to write you a letter of recommendation this spring.
- Letters of recommendation from coaches, specialty areas and employers can also be included.
- Provide them with a copy of your resume.
- In addition to the asking verbally, an electronic request must be sent through Naviance.

3. Sign up for the SAT/ACT

- Counselors will review how to sign up for the SAT at our December/January junior group meeting.
- It is recommended that juniors who plan on going to a 4 year college take the SAT/ACT:
 - 1-2 times during the winter and spring junior year
 - 1-2 times during the fall of senior year
- It is the student's responsibility to sign up for the SAT and ACT exams and send his or her scores to the colleges:
 - SAT: www.collegeboard.org
 - ACT: www.act.org
- Please be aware of deadlines!
- Fee waivers are available to students receiving free or reduced lunch – please see your counselor.

4. Create A List of Colleges

It's okay to have a large list – you will narrow it down as the school year progresses.

Counselors will meet with you in you classes to complete the Super
 College Match in Naviance.

- By next year, refine your list to include:
 - 2-3 "reach" schools
 - 2-3 "target" schools
 - 2-3 "safety" schools

5. Visit Potential Schools


- It is very important to meet with admission representatives and to visit campuses!
- Attend college fairs in person and virtual!
- Visit colleges on "Open House" days.
- Schedule an appointment with a college admissions office for an official visit or virtual visits.
 - This is usually completed online through the admissions' website.
- Visit and stay over with a friend who attends a school that you are interested in.
- Take advantage of college visits at Kittatinny! They will be virtual visits this year. You must sign up on Naviance and you will receive a link to the virtual visit.



College Visits at KRHS

To register for a visit:

- Log into yourNaviance Account
- Click on "My Colleges" then "College Visits"
- Click on the school/date that you are interested in to register



All visits will be virtual this year. Those who are registered will receive a link to the virtual vist the day of their assigned visit.


